God's Words are His thoughts expressed in words. The Bible has much to say about God's thoughts.

Jeremiah 29:11 says, "I know the thoughts I think toward you, says the Lord, thoughts of peace (good) and not of evil, to give you a future and a hope." The NIV says it this way, "I know the plans I have for you, plans to prosper you and not harm you." He goes on to say in verses 12–13, "Then you will call upon Me and go and pray to Me, and I will listen to you. And you will seek Me and find Me, when you search for Me with all your heart." The Lord thinks good thoughts about us! ... He plans to prosper us, give us a future, and give us hope! ... His thoughts toward us are thoughts of peace and good. He thinks good thoughts of us. And we can know what those thoughts are! All we have to do is ask Him. ...

God's good thoughts about us are too numerous to list all of them. But I must talk about His thoughts toward us that are written in Psalm 139.
